- Awards and honours

Daily current affairs revision can help you build confidence in this section.

Indian Polity

Focus on the Constitution of India and important political institutions.

Important areas include:

- Fundamental Rights
- Directive Principles
- Fundamental Duties
- Parliament
- President and Vice-President
- Prime Minister and Council of Ministers
- Supreme Court
- High Courts
- Constitutional bodies
- Local government

Labour Laws and Social Security

This is an important area for EPFO aspirants because the job is closely connected with labour administration and social security.

Candidates should understand basic concepts related to:

- Labour welfare
- Social security
- Provident fund
- Pension
- Employee benefits
- Industrial relations
- Trade unions
- Labour legislation

Do not simply memorise laws. Try to understand their purpose and practical application.

General English

English preparation should focus on understanding and correct usage.

Important topics can include:

- Grammar
- Vocabulary
- Synonyms and antonyms
- Reading comprehension
- Sentence correction
- Fill in the blanks
- Idioms and phrases
- Error detection

Regular reading can naturally improve vocabulary and comprehension skills.

Quantitative Aptitude and Reasoning

Candidates should practise basic mathematical and logical concepts regularly.

Important topics may include:

- Percentages
- Ratio and proportion
- Profit and loss
- Average
- Time and work
- Simple and compound interest
- Number system
- Data interpretation
- Coding-decoding
- Series
- Logical reasoning
- Analytical ability

Regular practice is more useful than studying these topics only once.

How to Prepare for UPSC EPFO 2026

1. Understand the Syllabus First
